- Think about how other people feel in different situations


We want them to have a rich vocabulary to describe how they feel, how others feel including 'real' people and those characters in the stories they read and the films they watch. Being empathic is such an important quality in life - to be able to connect with another human being by trying to understand what the world would 'look like' standing in their shoes, even at such an early stage in their life, is the step towards a more peaceful world. Utopian? Idealistic? Perhaps...but this is what we expect at Avanti Court...we want our young people to be the future leaders of change, the contributors, the connectors...the inspirers.

Having empathy starts with the realisation that there are other people in the world - simple and yet complex to achieve in reality. David Goleman, the popular psychologist and author of many books summed up how empathy can lead to action and shows what we (parents and teachers together) hope to achieve.

"Self-absorption in all its forms kills empathy, let alone compassion. When we focus on ourselves, our world contracts as our problems and preoccupations loom large. But when we focus on others, our world expands. Our own problems drift to the periphery of the mind and so seem smaller, and we increase our capacity for connection - or compassionate action." — Daniel Goleman, Social Intelligence: The New Science of Human Relationships
