OUR SCHOOL PRIORITIES 2016-2017

The effective deployment of additional adults is effective so that teaching is of a consistently high quality, which ensures high quality progression for all learners.

Priority 4: To raise attendance to 97%

Priority 5: To raise the attainment of writing across the school particularly for the higher attainers/ vulnerable groups. ACHIEVEMENT

Priority 6: To develop the outdoor area in the EYFS so it is vibrant and used creatively to support different aspects of the curriculum and promotes rich talk and learning opportunities.

Priority 7: To ensure the school is ready for 2018 when the school is at full capacity.
