OUR SCHOOL PRIORITIES 2016-2017

These are the areas that we will be focusing on as a school over the next year

Priority 1: To further embed assessment procedures to plan for children's learning needs, including the identification of pupils, or groups of pupils, falling behind in their learning or who need additional support thus enabling pupils to continue to make outstanding progress and to achieve well.

Priority 2: To further develop and improve the accountability and effectiveness of the leadership team so all leaders have a good understanding of the school's strengths and weaknesses. Priority 3: Teachers use well-judged and often inspirational teaching strategies, including setting appropriate homework, that, together with sharply focused and timely support and intervention, match individual needs accurately and accelerate progress. The effective deployment of additional adults is effective so that teaching is of a consistently high quality, which ensures high quality progression for all learners.

Priority 4: To raise attendance to 97%

Priority 5: To raise the attainment of writing across the school particularly for the higher attainers/vulnerable groups.

ACHIEVEMENT Priority 6: To develop the outdoor area in the EYFS so it is vibrant and used creatively to support different aspects of the curriculum and promotes rich talk and learning opportunities.

ACHIEVEMENT Priority 7: To ensure the school is ready for 2018 when the school is at full capacity.
