## Message from the Head Teacher

Dear Parents/Carers and Children,

Last term Mark Evans, the Director of Education for Avanti Schools Trust, made a formal visit to monitor the work of the school. Mr Evans collated his views of the school in a letter, which I quote and include in this newsletter.

Dear James...

*... I was particularly impressed by the ways in which you and your staff have developed processes for recording progress of Early Years, capturing key developmental events on stickers and putting them in children's folders/large format books. I found these books delightful. They show, already, evidence of real progress. Needless to say, we spent only a little time on a review of a few books. It would be good to see these again during a visit this term. We also discussed the Ethics and Philosophy course and the Christmas material in particular. We also touched on Collective Worship and its aims, structures and assessment. We are aware that this is a key, but potentially challenging, aspect of the whole Trust's work. Again, I would welcome a further discussion when we meet later this term....*

*... We spent some time, together with another member of your staff, in a Philosophy and Ethics session. This took the form of a workshop with a starter session from staff followed by pupils' working in groups and then presenting. All pupils were enthused and engaged and presented well. Staff engagement and awareness was good, with intervention as necessary and of an appropriate lightness. The session was very well paced...*

*... The school is making good progress under your leadership. The site is vibrant and the pupils engaged and happy with the service they are being offered. Staff are energetic and interactions between them and pupils are humane, focused and relaxed. All indications are that the school is very well regarded by parents and the wider community. I know that, under your leadership, this has been, quite rightly in my view, a key element of the school's work....*

## Chicken Pox: the Facts!

Chickenpox is a mild and common childhood illness that most children catch at some point.

It causes a rash of red, itchy spots that turn into fluid-filled blisters. They then crust over to form scabs, which eventually drop off. To prevent spreading the infection, keep children off nursery or school until all the spots have crusted over.

Chickenpox is most infectious from one to two days before the rash starts, until all the blisters have crusted over (usually five to six days after the start of the rash).

Some time ago parents and teachers met to explore the key priorities for our first year. I thought that it is important to share these objectives with you again so that you understand where we are aiming.

## How do we ensure Good Teaching?

The Senior Leadership team as well as external partners (Local Authority, Wroxham Teaching and Learning Alliance, Avanti Schools Trust, Local schools) monitor the quality of teaching and how this impacts on learning.

- Lesson observations – the Head Teacher and Deputy Head Teacher observe teachers and teaching assistants
- Book monitoring to see how children are progressing in their written and recorded learning
- Learning Walks – when the leadership team walk around the school and speak to children about their learning
- Pupil Conferences – the Head Teacher meets a group of different children each week to talk about their learning and to identify how they are improving and where they are not.
- Avanti Schools Trust visits
- Local Authority visits
- Local school support – moderation of our judgments of children's learning and assessments (we worked with Fullwood, an Outstanding local school, in comparing our children's assessment data with theirs)
