Talking about your body

Children are naturally inquisitive about their bodies and as they grow ask

questions which sometimes might make an adult, their parent or teacher, stumble for an answer. It is perfectly normal to talk to your child about their body, using correct language if you are happy to do so. Parents have told us that their children are asking questions and hearing things from older siblings. Look at www.parenting.com and www.parenting.com<

- 1. Don't laugh or giggle even if the question is cute. Children shouldn't feel ashamed for curiosity
- 2. Try not to appear embarrassed or overly serious.
- Be brief and matter of fact and don't go into long explanation. Answer simply.
- 4. Be honest and use proper names for body parts.
- 5. Follow up your answer with "does that answer your question" and listen to their reactions.
- 6. Be prepared to repeat yourself.

Also follow the NSPCC guidance about the right type of touch and the importance of always telling an adult when they feel something does not feel right.
