# 2012-13: End of Year Report to Parents

This is a report to show the progress and achievement of children at Avanti Court in our first year. We have asked questions to help you navigate the data so it makes sense.

## What is the progress and achievement of children in Reception and Year 1?

### Year 1 Progress:

We measure progress using a point system. Over three terms (Summer to Summer) a good level of progress is anything above 4 points. For this year we can measure Autumn to Summer (so anything above 3 points is considered good by the Government)

Reading: The class made 4.87points

Writing: The class made 4.80points

Maths: The class made 4.93points

This shows **very good** progress.

### Year 1 Achievement:

At the end of Year 1 children should reach a certain level (called 1a). We are pleased to report the following achievement percentages.

Reading: 93% achieved the expected level. 56% of the class were above this level.

Writing: 93% achieved the expected level. 39% were well above this level.

Maths: 90% achieved the expected level. 30% were above this level.

### Reception:

#### Good Level of Development (GLD)

The measurement for progress in Reception is less defined. Children progress at different pace depending on their age, experience and attitudes.

A large percentage of children entered the school learning at 30-50 months which is lower than the expected 40-60 months. Very good progress has made with 81% children achieving expectations of the Early Learning Goal and a Good Level of Development.

A Good Level of Development is defined as all children who have achieved the 3 Prime Areas of Learning (Physical Development, Communication and Language, Personal, social and emotional development and Literacy and Maths).

If we compare the school's 81% with the National average from last year's pilot data at 41%, the school is having a positive and significant impact on children's learning.

### Phonics:

Year 1: At the end of Year 1 children have a National phonics check to find out how well they can sound out and decode words. These include nonsense words (blump) that need to be phonetically read. 90% children passed the check compared with 48% in last year's National data. This shows that we have impacted significantly on children's phonic awareness and ability to read and are doing better than the National Average (pilot).

Reception: 89% of children are working at the expected phase 3 at the end of Reception.

## How well do children entitled to Pupil Premium Grant (those entitled to Free School Meals)?

For all children entitled to Free School Meals the school gains funding to provide additional support to meet their specific needs. We publish how this is used on our website. We monitor all additional support to ensure it is actually having good impact on pupils' learning and achievement. All the 8 children made good progress.

## How much progress do Special Needs Children make?

All children with specific needs made good progress over the year although they have not all made the expected Early Learning Goals. Some children take longer and with our careful interventions and good teaching, they will continue to make good progress to meet their individual targets.

## How do we ensure children are challenged?

**Reception:** Pupils who are exceeding the expected level are being provided with the following activities in the next few weeks to further challenge them:

1. Writing- *My next steps* strategy to encourage self-correction is introduced. Use of self-assessment sheets.
2. Reading- Words sent home to practice then used in comprehension activities and written work.
3. Maths- Problem solving activities and games, extension groups during focussed activities

**Year One:** 30% of children in Year 1 have exceeded in Maths, 56% have exceeded in Reading and 39.9% in Writing. The following has been done to further extend:

1. Literacy- Support from Literacy Advanced Skills Teacher with regard to planning and challenge
2. Home-learning project based on Maths
3. More focus on targets and next steps

Overall we have had a successful first year. Teachers have worked tirelessly for your children to provide them with exciting and engaging curriculum, which has included trips, visitors and theatre groups, a school farm and numerous opportunities to perform and celebrate their learning. I am grateful for all my staff's hard work. As you can imagine, opening a new school has considerable challenges, many of which we hope you have never known about – so that it is always a positive and happy environment for you and your child.

### FOAC Money Raised

Big congratulations to everyone involved in raising money for our school. We are pleased to report that over the year you have raised £2575. The summer fair alone raised £1337.

We will be asking everyone in our community how best to use this money

There has been some misinformation regarding school's budget and funding. Some parents have spread the idea that all schools are given a lump sum of money to pay for parent association activities this is not the case. Our very tight budget is mostly spent on staffing, bills and only a small percentage remains for pupil's books and curriculum. We budget for a small amount for specific events e.g. the Diwali event.

### NEW CLASS IN YEAR 1

We have had to add another class in year one next year because more children have been offered a place by the local authority. We rearranged classes considering gender balance, the dynamic of children's mix and how well children will adapt to changes. **There is no ability labelling or grouping.**

We know that some parents may have concerns but we will always work to help children develop the resilience to manage changes in life. After all this is such an important skill in life.

Some parents have said that children won't have their old friends but we know that this move will encourage them to make new friends as well as keep their old ones.

We will not be able to meet requests to change class lists.

A big congratulations to the children who were only absent for half a day ALL YEAR! That means over 99.5%; Janhavi, Pavan, Ravi, Rishaa, Jahnuzan. & an INCREDIBLE HOORAY for the children who had NO DAYS out of school; Sree Manas, Joshan N, Tashi, Heeya, Shivani P and Amreena. The children have been invited on a special trip with the Head Teacher next Wednesday! Attendance really matters. Well done children, you are preparing life skills for when you are an adult and get a job!
