Message from the Principal

Dear Parents, Carers and Friends

Not much stands still at Avanti House and this has been an exceptionally busy start to the academic year. We have doubled our numbers in the Primary phase with over 50 new Reception youngsters joining our two Year One classes. Owing to a delay in the building works, our four classes have not yet been able to settle fully into the accommodation but I am delighted to report that, following our half-term break, the pupils will be able to access their new classrooms which are now almost finished. Can I thank Mrs Sahni, the new Headteacher at Krishna Avanti, for her help in resolving some of the logistical issues which have arisen. Our secondary pupils are now enjoying a building all to themselves at the former Peterborough and St. Margaret's site in Stanmore and will have access to a brand new ICT suite once they return in November. One abiding memory for me this term would have to be an open air assembly with our Year Eight pupils with the sun shining through the trees and rabbits and squirrels as attentive observers! Our new teaching and support staff have settled in very well and have helped us to expand the range of after-school activities on offer.

A major event for us was the Open Evening for September 2014 secondary admissions on September 24th which was attended by over 750 parents and pupils. There was a really positive

atmosphere and all those attending were bowled over by the spirit, courtesy and enthusiasm of our students and staff who are great ambassadors for Avanti House. With a further one hundred plus attending the Open mornings, I think we can safely say that Avanti House is well and truly on the map.

Each Thursday as I preview the calendar for the week following, I am struck by just how much goes on beyond the formal curriculum. This week we are hosting the Rt. Hon.

Justine Greening MP, Secretary of State for International Development, elections for

the student council will be concluded and on Friday our Primary and secondary phases – now almost three hundred pupils- will join in a special celebration assembly at the Stanmore site.

As I say, not much stands still at Avanti House as we go from strength to strength, grateful as ever for the vibrant pupil body, the dedicated staff and governors and for the support we receive from yourselves as parents and carers. Long may it continue.

Philosophy and Ethics

The launch of Philosophy and Ethics as separate lessons on the curriculum has gone well! The theme of this half term's work has been 'Beginnings". 'Celebration of El día de los muertos — the Day of the Dead' El día de los muertos is one of the biggest holidays in Mexico and has a great importance throughout Latin America. It began almost 4 thousand years ago during the time of the Aztec empire and in el día de los muertos, death — or at least the memories of those who have died — is something to be celebrated. The most common custom for this day is the making of elaborate altars filled with yellow marigolds and candles, to welcome departed spirits home. Festivities also include traditional food and lots of people go to the streets to take part in great parades, very similar to a carnival. They dress up in bright coloured dresses and they also paint their faces like skulls. In Avanti House the MFL department wants to celebrate the date with a big competition.
