Secondary Phase

Pupil Premium is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. The Education Funding Agency pays the premium directly to free schools. In the 2013 to 2014 financial year schools received £900 for each eligible secondary-aged pupil. In the 2014 to 2015 financial year schools will receive £935 for each eligible secondary-aged pupil. In addition to this schools will receive £1900 for each looked-after pupil who:

- has been looked after for 1 day or more
- was adopted from care on or after 30 December 2005, or left care under:
 - a special guardianship order
 - a residence order
