Renewal of Home-School Agreement

We will be reviewing our home school agreement this term. You should receive a draft copy of the Home-School agreement that will have a section for children too. The document clarifies basic expectations that the school, pupils and the parents can have of each other to support highly effective education, care and well-being of all our learners. We would like every family to sign up to the renewed agreement before next term.

Introduction to Taekwondo

Classes in Taekwondo begin this half term for Years 5 and 6, with the explicit aim of helping them to develop, physical stamina and flexibility, as well as, self-discipline, focus and control. A Taekwondo after-school club will begin from January 2015 and should offer excellent terms of engagement for all pupils age 5 upwards. Taking care during winter

As winter is fast approaching the playground and walkways into school may be slippery. We will grit the icy areas. Please take care when coming into school on the cold and slippery wintery mornings as parents and children rush in for the 8am start.

Attendence and Punctualilty

Thank you for all your support in keeping and ensuring that attendance is good. Our school's average is currently at 97.5%. Let's work together to aim for 99%. If children are not here they can't be learning.

Focusing on self-discipline:

As part of our drive to encourage children to experience better self-discipline, the staff and I have currently revising our policy on rewards, responsibilities and sanctions. A greater focus on personal and social responsibility means that the school will take a much more serious view of persistent breaches of school rules and behavior that are disruptions to learning of other children. Persistently poor behavior is unacceptable as it gets in the way of happiness and safety of many. Fortunately there are no more than a handful of children who fall foul of school expectations. The vast majority of our children are orderly and hard working. They are very keen that their learning should not suffer because of a disturbance caused by a few. I will circulate the outcomes of our review for your comments before finalising these.

Homework return is looking very good. Many thanks for your time and effort in supporting children with their home learning. Your help at home makes a huge impact on children's motivation to learn and succeed – we can see the difference where it makes when children are receiving regular help at home.



You will be pleased to know that over the holidays 65 new tablets were installed with an excellent range of software to promote a wider range of high quality personalised learning for all the children. I am sure you will hear a lot more about this once the children start using the new learning tools...Any volunteers out there to give children 1 to 1 sessions on becoming expert users of the tablets ??
