"I enjoyed the mammal trapping as there was always a new place to hide our traps which meant more exploring" Milan






The children who didn't attend the residential were amazing helpers. They helped Reception children to read and Year 2 children to undertake an art challenge.

**Sherpa Kids** - After careful consideration, John Geers (club leader) has decided to no longer host Sherpa Kids at KAPS. Therefore, come the Autumn Term (September 2017) this club will no longer be available and parents will have to look for an alternative arrangement. We are looking at options of hosting a new club and will inform parents if this does take effect.

Parents may wish to note that the government has introduced an additional 30 hours per week of free childcare over 38 weeks. Although this is aimed at children between the ages of 2-4 years, there are other childcare options that parents may be eligible to apply for and parents can check whether they are eligible for a range of government childcare offers, including 30 hours, via Childcare Choices at: <u>https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk</u> or the Childcare Calculator at: <u>https://www.gov.uk/childcare-calculator</u>

If parents are eligible for 30 hours per week of free childcare (over 38 weeks) or other childcare options they may wish to visit Harrow Council website that has a list of registered child-minders. **Pupil Premium:** The Pupil Premium is funding from the Department for Education which is additional to the main school funding. It is allocated according to the number of pupils on-roll who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), a smaller amount is allocated according to the number of children of service families, and an allocation for each pupil who has been, Looked After" (in care) for 6 months or more or a pupil who was adopted in the UK. In our school funds are allocated, for example, to support parents in purchasing school uniform, to support children's achievement and their participation in extra- curricular activities including school trips.

To find out if you qualify for the Pupil Premium Grant, please use the Free School Meals eligibility checker by visiting <u>http://fsm.lgfl.net</u>. Once you have accessed the website, you will be able to quickly and easily check if you are entitled. It gives you an immediate "yes" or "no" response and may notify the school. IF YOUR CHILD WAS ENTITLED TO FREE SCHOOL MEALS LAST YEAR, YOU MUST STILL RE –APPLY USING THE ABOVE WEBSITE. It's quick and easy to find out if you are eligible and it only takes a moment!
