They will do various sketches and then translate their design into a 3D piece of artwork. 

#### Suggestions:


Buttons, sequences, fabric, empty food packaging, wool, plastic tops, newspaper, pompoms, artificial feathers etc.






**THOUGHT OF THE WEEK** During last week's worship and yoga sessions we thought about the importance of Lent and how there are similarities in the actions in Hinduism.

We also had a moving presentation to celebrate Shivarati. Unfortunately, I was unable to attend but heard how gracefully the children had performed. Well done to our Year 6 children.



**Key Stage 1**- We started the class with pranayam and our yogi poki song (sun salutations). We learned about sacrifice and what it means. It means to give up something that will make you happy for another's benefit. We learned about different types of sacrifices and how the story of the Monkey King sacrificed his life for saving the other monkeys in his kingdom by making himself into a bridge so the other monkeys could cross the river. We learned a new yoga pose called the bridge.



**Key Stage 2**- We got settled into the class by doing some breathing exercises (pranayama). Then we got warmed up by doing sun salutations. We refreshed our memory regarding all the yoga poses we have learnt and their Sanskrit names. We categorized them as sitting down, standing up and lying down yoga poses. We read a story about the mother's sacrifice for her son. Learning about sacrifices in different spiritual traditions such as Lent and

Ramadan, we learned that we show sacrifice by doing Ekadashi. We played a game of passing the treasure; whoever got the treasure sacrificed it to someone else to make them happy. The people that received the treasure from one of their classmates thanked them.

## LOOKING AFTER PETS and ANIMALS

This week we will consider the importance of looking after animals and pets. We will encourage a respect and reverence for all life forms.

We are fortunate that Mrs Beresford has two dogs, one which is a rescue dog.

She has kindly agreed to bring Rody to school. She will deliver a presentation on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> March about promoting good practice in animal care. She will share her knowledge.

The assembly will be in two parts with KS1 at 8.00am and KS2 at 8.30am.

The assembly will not allow the children to touch or handle Rody, keeping line with the school risk assessment.

If you do not wish you child to attend the talk, please let your child's class teacher know. If this is the case, your child will stay in class and learn about caring for pets via a power point.

If we do not hear from you, the class teacher will assume that you are in agreement to your child attending assembly.
