Not being punctual to school reduces your child's chance of success. Your child's

progress could drop across ALL subjects!

Your child will be missing learning opportunities if they are not in school or are late to school. We work closely with our Education Welfare Officer and unauthorised absences could result in fixed penalty fine. Please work with us to provide your child with the best chances of learning, by ensuring they are in school every day and on time.

SAFEGUARDING AFTER SCHOOL Thank you for choosing to send your child to an after school club. It is pleasing to hear that many children are benefiting from attending these enrichment opportunities.

I would like to update you that Miss Patel and I shall be holding a meeting with the club leaders to remind them of their duty of responsibility and to promote the welfare of children under their care.

I am in the process of requesting all club leaders to wear a visible ID badges and will ask them to ensure that in the first few weeks of starting a club they know exactly who is signing their register to collect a child at the end of a session.

This will forge safer practice and ensure that no child goes home with a person who is not listed on the collection list.

The new system will echo the process we have in school at normal pick up time at 2.30pm. However, if you are late for collecting your child, they will be safely escorted to Sherpa Kids childminding service. We will contact you to let you know what has happened. You will then be charged by Sherpa Kids whilst they look after your child.

Failure to collect your child on time can be viewed as neglect of care. Please ensure that children do not become anxious or distress by late pick- ups.

If you have any queries about this serious matter, please do not hesitate to speak to Miss Patel or myself. We are the Designated Safeguarding Leads for the school. **Sherpa Kids** - After careful consideration, John Geers (club leader) has decided to no longer host Sherpa Kids at KAPS. Therefore, come the Autumn Term (September 2017) this club will no longer be available and parents will have to look for an alternative arrangement. We are looking at options of hosting a new club and will inform parents if this does take effect.

Parents may wish to note that the government has introduced an additional 30 hours per week of free childcare over 38 weeks. Although this is aimed at children between the ages of 2-4 years, there are other childcare options that parents may be eligible to apply for and parents can check whether they are eligible for a range of government childcare offers, including 30 hours, via Childcare Choices at: <u>https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk</u> or the Childcare Calculator at: <u>https://www.gov.uk/childcare-calculator</u>

If parents are eligible for 30 hours per week of free childcare (over 38 weeks) or other childcare options they may wish to visit Harrow Council website that has a list of registered child-minders. Pupil Premium - funding to support vulnerable learners - The Pupil Premium is funding from the Department for Education which is additional to the main school funding. It is allocated according to the number of pupils on-roll who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), a smaller amount is allocated according to the number of children of service families, and an allocation for each pupil who has been 'Looked After' (in care) for 6 months or more. Funds are allocated, for example, to support parents in purchasing school uniform, to support children's achievement and their participation in extra- curricular activities including school trips.
