YOGA LESSONS

The children have been starting their classes with Surya Namaskar and pranayam. They have been learning about Martin Luther King Jr. and his contribution to the world. They learned that all humans are created equally because Krishna is in everyone's hearts. Humans have two hands and two feet, hence regardless of where you come from we can change the world to make it a better place. The children sang a song by Jack Johnson called "My Own Two Hands" and carried out yoga asana sequences to it.
