Gaura Purnima means "Golden Full Moon". The name signifies that Lord Caitanya took birth at time of full moon and He blesses



YOGA and MINDFULNESS LESSONS

Attendance week ending 3rd March was 96%. The current school attendance for the academic year to date is 96.6%. Your support would be appreciated for us to reach our academic year target of 97%.

37 children were late this week



The classroom doors open from 7.50am so there is no excuse for being late and ready to learn.

Our target for the academic year is 97%.

We have the highest aspirations for our children and every lesson counts towards your child's achievement. We also know that you want your child to get on well in life. Children only get one chance at school, and your child's chances of a successful future may be affected by not attending school every day on time. When children do not attend or are late they struggle to keep up with school work, miss out on the social side of school life – especially at primary school. Poor attendance can affect children's ability to make and keep friendships; a vital part of growing up.

There is a clear link between poor attendance at school and lower academic achievement. In primary schools, less than 65% of children get good results in Maths and English in schools, when they have an average of 15 days absence, compared to around 90% in schools where the average is less than 8 days. Many parents are surprised how quickly their children accumulate 15 days absence.

Class teachers will be giving a letter to you should we have concerns about your child's attendance or punctuality.

May I respectfully remind you that we have to closely monitor attendance at school. It is a statutory legal requirement.

We expect you to work closely with us in adhering to the DfE and Harrow local authority guidelines.

Discussion Points Raised	Suggestions put forward, Plan of action
Enhancing communication between class teachers and parents	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have email contact details of class teachers directly • Once every half term, have an open forum at the end of the school day for parents and teachers to share and discuss information. • Mrs Rai to be available at informal times, rather than making an appointment via the Office. • The telephone system – cut down on the options that are available. It takes too long before you are able to speak to the office team.
Pupils being exposed to different cultures	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The school continues to raise the profile of all the different festivals, religions and spiritual, moral, social cultural events that are taught within the school. Parents will be invited to support with the learning too. • The weekly newsletter will continue to publish information regarding religious, cultural and diversity awareness and appreciation. • Links are made with other schools too. Currently Year 5 has made a link with a Jewish Faith school.
Pupils drinking water during lessons	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teachers allow pupils to sip water during lessons. However, they monitor the situation and have a discussion with individuals who are constantly not concentrating.
Pupils visiting the Toilet	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teachers are aware of meeting the needs of pupils with medical needs. However, they are also mindful of pupils who visit the toilet during lesson time. This stops valuable learning time. • Teachers will continue to remind children that they must visit the toilet during break times.
Behaviour for Learning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We follow the Good to Be Green Behaviour system in school. We expect all children to adhere to it. • Poor behaviour is addressed swiftly. The class teacher will continue to liaise with parents.

HOMEWORK/HOME LEARNING REVIEW The Forum discussed the setting of Homework. Please kindly complete the questionnaire at Parent Consultation evening. Our School Council will also be conducting a survey with a random number of children from their class. The school Team will also complete a survey.



Once all results are analysed and information triangulated, a clear way forward about home learning will be presented to you.

Pupil Premium - funding to support vulnerable learners_The Pupil Premium is funding from the Department for Education which is additional to the main school funding. It is allocated according to the number of pupils on-roll who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), a smaller amount is allocated according to the number of children of service families, and an allocation for each pupil who has been 'Looked After' (in care) for 6 months or more. Funds are allocated, for example, to support parents in purchasing school uniform, to support children's achievement and their participation in extra- curricular activities including school trips.
