# Message from the Head Teacher

Dear Parents/Carers and Children,

Pirates took over the school on Monday as Year 1 started their literacy unit finding out how pirates lived on ships – a wonderful way of linking all the subjects and connecting meaning. Have a look at their film trailer on the Avanti Schools Trust Facebook.

On Wednesday a small group of parents joined Edward Anobah, Vishal Merai (Chair and Vice-Chair of Governors) and me to discuss Avanti Court's future communication strategy. Edward related communication to the teachings in the Bhagavad Gita, "Austerity of speech consists in speaking words that are **truthful**, **pleasing**, **beneficial** and not agitating to others" (Cp.17 Text 14) and that communication is about relationships in the same way that community is about relationships. These are our guiding principles so that everyone models the behavior for our children so that school, parents and children build our special community.

We are a **listening school** and hope that you know that my team and I are always ready to hear your views to support our development. None of us are perfect and we will listen, reflect and as appropriate act to develop what we do and how we do it. There will NEVER be any recourse to your child should you have a concerns and raise them with the class teacher or leadership team – we will never operate in such a way and always treat children equally and kindly. There were many good suggestions given at our Communication Workshop on Wednesday – many thanks to Chet Patel and Shahida Khan (parents) who are leading on developing our strategy with me.

One key learning for me was that, generally, parents need more information about the changes taking place as the school grows; the recruitment of teachers, how children are being rearranged into new classes and class sizes. Misinformation, myths and legends have sprung from playground conversations and so one step in improving communication is to explain the processes and truth behind this misinformation.

# **Recruitment Strategy 2013**

As you may know we are recruiting new teachers and teaching assistants to join our team. We have already recruited an experienced teacher for Year 1. We have high expectations for all members of staff. These are the criteria on which we make judgements:

- 1. Qualified Teacher with successful experience in schools
- 2. Good Academic Qualifications
- 3. Good references
- 4. Motivation: What is their motivation for working with children and why Avanti Court?
- 5. Safeguarding: are they aware of their responsibilities to safeguard all children?
- 6. Spiritual Insight: do they understand what we mean by this? Can they contribute to the spiritual well being and development of our children?
- 7. Teaching: do they have successful recent experience teaching primary aged children? Can they articulate and show how they have been reflective, how they develop children's creativity, with high expectations for academic progress and with precise analysis of data to raise standards?
- 8. Attitude: will they strive to create our school, with a no excuses attitude so that every child really does matter?

# How are children allocated new classes each year?

This is the strategy...Children will be rearranged into new classes at the end of Reception, Year 2 and Year 4. This aims to support children in learning to cope with change and transitions in life and in school; also because of the constantly changing intake of children which may unbalance classes. We use the following criteria to ensure there is a good:

- Gender balance
- Ethnicity mix
- Free School Meal/Vulnerable children mix
- Children with English as an Additional Language balance
- Children with Special Educational Needs balance
  - Autumn, Spring and Summer born mix
- Consulting children and parents: (1) We ask children to say (a) Who they play nicely with and (b) who they work well with. (2)We ask parents for their views and opinions

We will start this process before half term and inform you of your child's new class, teacher and class name after half term. Rests assured, we have activities and experience in supporting children with this transition. Please talk to your child from now explaining that they are going to Year 1 next year, will have fun and will have a new class and new friends as well as old ones!

# **Teaching Assistants:**

Each class in Reception will have a Teaching Assistant full time

Each class in KS1 (Year 1 and 2) will have a Teaching Assistant every morning. In the afternoon, the TAs will work with identified groups of children who either need extra support, challenge or for other needs – these will be bespoke interventions to support children who we consider need it (having analysed data, observed them in class, considered their books and overall learning and of course in full discussion with parents).

Class Sizes: Unless we have more children joining us this year, we will split the Reception classes (currently 80 children) into three Year I classes (26-27 children in each) Not more than statutory size of 30

# Building our future...

Building work will start from 1<sup>st</sup> August and continue to January 2014. This will involve: 1. Reconstruction of admin area


- 2. Redecoration of Reception classrooms and outdoor area (ready for new intake in Sept13)
- 3. Development of Nursery and outdoor Nursery play area
  - 4. New boiler, air handling units, drainage (all the things we can't see!)

We will inform you how children will enter and leave school. We have a good relationship with our building contractors and they are very aware of the need to reduce the impact on children. We already have a good strategy in place and will share this with you when we have more detail from the builders.
